Yes, yes it did. We're a little bit different in that most 'pop acts' get signed where they're really young – we were like 27 when we got our record deal, we're almost the older statesmen of pop now. Well your music still sounds remarkably youthful, how do you stay so young?

It doesn't really bother you, because at the end of the day, when you look out from the stage and see so many very happy people with smiling faces having an awesome night out, it really washes over you.

One reviewer described you as 'Toploader meets McFly'. Do you consider than an insult? Not at all – it's weird what some people like and dislike. It's all about personal taste. We're a Marmite band – you either love us or hate us.
